


## Nagoya Protocol on ABS

- Set of rules and principles for access and use of resources and associated traditional knowledge
- Adopted in 2010 in Nagoya
- 126 Parties (CBD Secretariat, 2020)
- Legally-binding, subject to national implementation





# COMMUNITIES RIGHTS AND COMMUNITY PROTOCOLS



### Rights of communities

#### Art. 6.2 – Access to resources

Based on the prior informed consent or approval and involvement of indigenous and local communities where they have the established right to grant access

## Art. 7 – Access to associated traditional knowledge

Based on the prior informed consent or approval and involvement of indigenous and local communities



Primary custodian of resources



Holder of traditional knowledge


## Challenges in community involvement in ABS

- Knowledge of communities of their rights
- **Prior consent**: to be requested from which structure? Representativeness of communities? ...
- **Customary laws and institutions**: how to integrate them into the dialogue?...
- Benefit-sharing negotiation: who should participate?
  Negotiating skills?...

# Nagoya Protocol on Community protocol:

- Take into consideration communities' customary laws, community protocols and procedures in implementing their obligations (Article 12.1)
- Support communities in the development of **community protocols** (Article 12.3)

# **Biocultural Community** Protocols for Livestock Keepers

Not necessarily a written document

## Community protocols

- Tools developed by communities
- Interface between communities and external actors
- Inform on terms and conditions to which communities would like to be approached by/engaged with external actors
- Refere to customary laws as well as national or international laws

The Mo'otz Kuxtal Voluntary Guidelines, adopted by the 13th Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity

## May include items like...



- Definition of the community;
- Leadership and decision-making processes
- Natural resource management systems, TK, innovations, and practices
- Ways of life, links between culture, spirituality, and customary laws and values
- Rights and responsibilities according to customary, national, and international law
- Conditions for granting access to TK, resources, land etc. such as FPIC, MAT
- Challenges faced by the community and calls to stakeholders to engage on issues
