Parties	<b>Applicant:</b> Non-governmental organisations including Friends of the Earth France, Greenpeace France, France Nature Environment (FNE), and France Nature Environment Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur
	Defendant: Prefect of Bouches-du-Rhône and Total
Key Facts	The applicants asserted that the Prefect of Bouches-du-Rhône failed to the climate and other environmental impacts of palm oil production and use into account when authorising the continued operation of Total's biofuel refinery.
The Court's Decision and Reasoning	<b>Decision</b> The Administrative Court of Marseille partially invalidated Total's permit to operate a biorefinery in France and directed the company to study the climate impacts of imported palm oil.
	<b>Reasoning</b> The court determined that the decision authorising the operation of the biofuel plant relied on insufficient information on climate impacts, and thus ordered a new study on the cumulative direct and indirect climate effects of the biorefinery project. After there is sufficient information on these direct and indirect climate effects, the regulator (the Prefect of Bouche-du-Rhône) can make an informed decision.
What now?	Total must conduct a new study on the cumulative direct and indirect climate effects associated with the palm oil production, importation, and use before the regulator can make an informed decision on the true climate impact of the biorefinery.
